| AREA Kokanee Creek drainage | ROADS Road is not plowed. Expect 0.5-1 meter of snow pack depth 1700m & above. | TRAILS Trail from Gibson Lake to the Kokanee Glacier Cabin: totally snow-covered, and particularly unsafe above Kokanee Lake, due to avalanche risk. Snow covered trails. Assess Avalanche risk before crossing snow slopes. Avalanche knowledge and gear (transceiver, shovel, probe, ski buddy) is required to travel safely. Be aware of avalanche risk in the alpine. Silver Spray/Woodbury/Sunset Lake Trails: condition unknown. Likely not to be cleared before mid-July at earliest | Trailhead to Woodbury Cabin: 8 km, moderate hike, elev. gain 762m (2.5-4 hrs). Woodbury Cabin sleeps 8, also camping nearby. Trail is not cleared at this time. Trailhead to Silver Spray Cabin: 6 km, strenuous hike, elev. gain 1016m (4-5 hrs). Cabin sleeps 10. Mining history and alpine meadows. Both cabins book through ACC reservation system (see above) for summer season only. Both cabins are closed during winter season as the hut location(s) poses avalanche hazard to users. 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| Purcell Wilderness Conservancy (west) | Lemon Creek, Sapphire Lakes Fry Creek | Road is snow covered, not plowed. Access via 6-mile Lakes Road and Summit South FSR is very rough in places. Current condition unknown. Lemon Creek FSR "officially" closed at 2 km. Not known if/when it will be reopened. Many extremely rough sections from Hwy 6 to 6-Mile Lakes road. Road through Johnson's Landing is open, but may be closed without notice if previous landslide area becomes active again. | Lemon Creek Trail was cleared in September 2021. Trails up Nilsik Creek and to Crazy Jane Lake have not been cleared. Portion from trailhead to Fry Creek is clear. Route above Fry Creek bridge up the canyon is NOT RECOMMENDED. This is a steep, narrow, exposed route, which is hard to follow. NOTE: Carney Creek cable car was removed at 8km. | 10 km Lemon Creek FSR to Sapphire Lakes, elev. gain 950m, moderate to strenuous hike with washed out sections (5 hrs) 3 km Kaslo Lake to Sapphire Lakes, moderate hike (1-2 hrs) No camping at Sapphire Lakes No camping at Sapphire Lakes 8.5 km up canyon, easy hike (1-1.5 hrs) 8.5 km up canyon to Carney Creek cable car crossing. | | Hamill Creek, Earl Grey Pass Fry Creek Cany | Road open above Argenta to trailhead | Expect windfall on the remaining open portion (east side) of trail. | The Earl Grey Trail will be receiving major upgrades including removing/ replacing cable cars, bridges and other trail work on Hamill Creek side (west side trailhead). The trail will be closed for repairs /major works and will be inaccessible to the public for the summer of 2022 from the section of Hamill Creek trailhead to Earl Grey Pass. For your safety, please observe this trail closure. Please continue to check this page for updates. Trail will remain open from the Toby Creek trailhead to Earl Grey pass. |
