












Welcome to the Park

Ten Mile Lake Provincial Park consists of 260 hectares on the tree-lined eastern shore of the lake. There are quiet, treed campsites, excellent fishing and lots of trails and beaches for family recreation. The name of the park comes from the milepost on the Pacific Great Eastern Railway that stood here in the early 1900's. There is still evidence of the abandoned rail grade in the park, but the tracks had to be relocated because of difficulties in crossing the Cottonwood River north of the park. Ten Mile Lake Park lies in a transition area between the wetter Quesnel Highlands to the east, and the dry Chilcotin Plateau to the west, leading to a wide diversity of plant species. You can find white spruce, trembling aspen and lodgepole pine, while the forest floor is home to shrubs like red osier dogwood and falsebox.

Things to Do

-  A self-guiding nature trail begins in the day use parking lot opposite the picnic shelter.
-  This park has a day-use/picnic area. Picnic tables, fire pits, pit toilets, a covered shelter, three long sandy beaches and change-houses are all located at the day-use area. The picnic shelter is reservable via the Discover Camping Reservation Service.
-  Two campgrounds provide both reservable and first come first served campsites. There are pull-through sites available in the Touring Campground.
-  Enjoy the ten kilometers of hiking trails that weave around the park.
-  There is a boat launch ramp at the entrance to the Lakeside Campground.
-  Fishing for rainbow trout is good in the early spring or on most summer evenings.
-  The sani-station is located in the main campground access road. There is a fee for its use.

Visitor Services

-  There are three long sandy beaches with two buoyed-off swim areas. There are no lifeguards on duty at provincial parks.
-  An adventure playground, large grassy area and horseshoe pits are found in the day-use area.
-  Visitors can use sani-station for a fee.
-  Washroom in campground is wheelchair accessible.

Enjoy Your Stay

Park regulations protect the natural state of the park and ensure a quality experience for all visitors. Fires are permitted in designated fire rings only. Visitors may bring firewood or purchase at park. Pets must be on a leash at all times. Please be responsible for their behaviour and waste. Anything with an odour could attract wildlife to your site. Place garbage in bins, avoid cooking inside tents and tent trailers, and store all food supplies, including coolers, in your vehicle. Generator use is only permitted between the hours of 9am – 11am, and from 6pm – 8pm. Quiet time is between the hours of 10pm and 7am. Alcohol is permitted only within the boundaries of campsites with registered occupants. Tents and equipment must be confined to the gravel portion of your site.

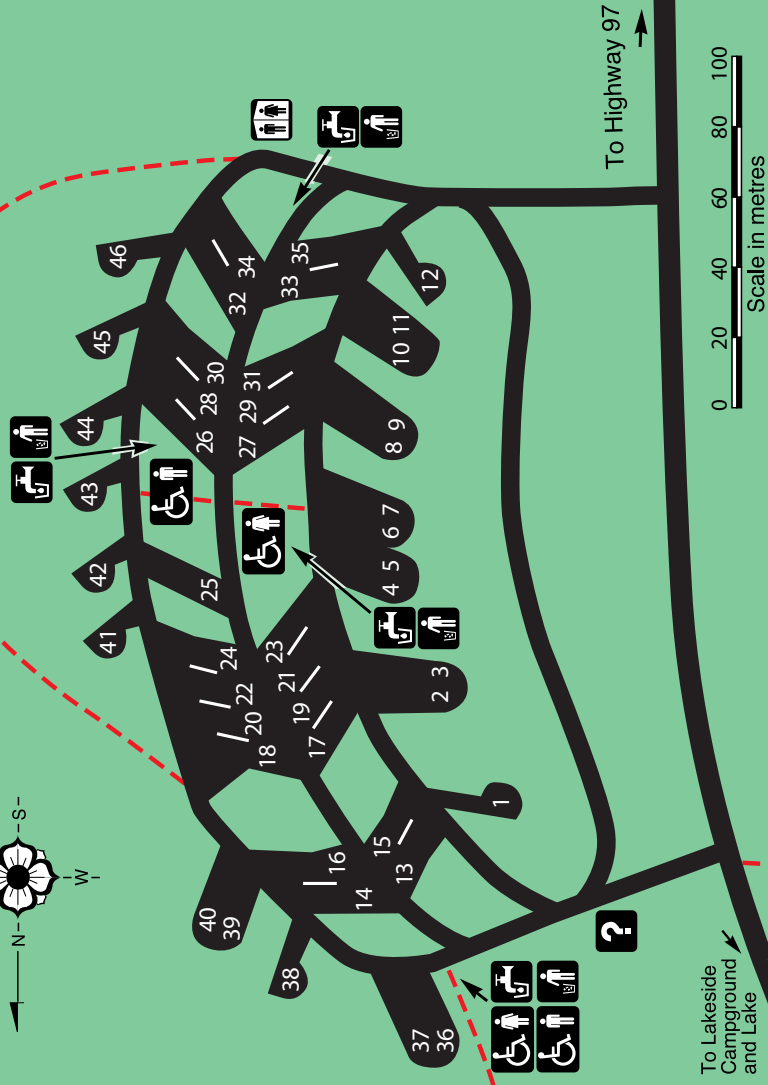
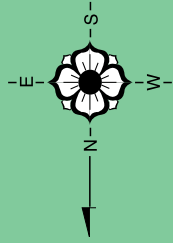

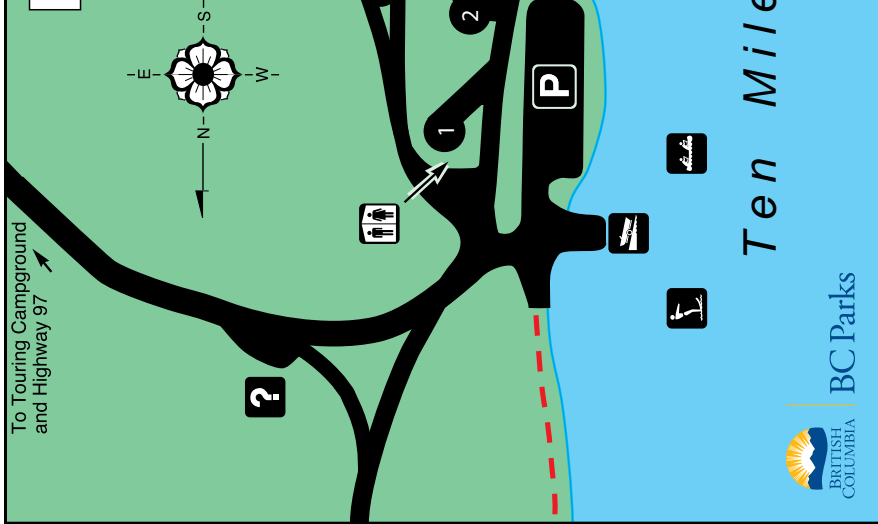
